New Acquisition 16 June 2018

I fought an expensive (for me) battle for this item on eBay with the added complication of a finish time of 12.30am. Why the seller in Spain wanted it to finish at that time I can only suppose he thought he was going to sell it to the USA or somewhere equally in a different time zone - and no I didn't stay up I just placed my best bid and went to bed.

What is it?

Well it's a German WW1 Occupation cover posted on the 4 January 1919 from Libau (Liepaja) Latvia to Cranz, Germany.

What makes it so special?

There are a lot of questions and concerns raised by this cover:

- This is the most forged overprint of any of the WW1 German Occupation overprints.
- It has one of the most forged postmarks.
- It is believed that very few (if any) actual covers bearing this issue have genuinely gone through the post.

OK after saying all that it has a number of attributes that suggest it could be genuine or at least a good contemporary philatelic confection.

- It has the correct postage rate.
- It is posted on the last day the German Feldpost Office was open.
- Other covers expertized as genuine have the same round military cachet and some have the lower left sender's mark "Josef Pokorny"

• It has a Cranz receiving mark on the rear dated 10.01.19.

The whole thing was concocted by the postal workers in the Feldpost, which by the way was housed in the Libau post office, to make money from the philatelic market. The canceller was used on civilian mail during the month


of January⁽¹⁾. The number of stamps overprinted (a google search) appears to be around a combined total of 2000 stamps. The Germania values overprinted were 21/2, 5, 10, 15, 20, 25 & 50pfg.

My personal take is that it is definitely philatelic but that's not a negative in this situation (quite a number of covers would not exist without the involvement of a stamp collector) and it's probably a confection at a later date (it was sold "as is").

I will be sending it off for an expert's certificate so I'll let you know what happens.

Who Your Friends Are


